Personal Stewardship

— A message from Pastor Becky, our Priest-In-Charge

This is one of those very rare Epiphany Seasons where we got to experience the most possible Sundays between January 6th and Easter: Eight. For four of those weeks, we focused on the six power practices of discipleship in our 17+10=CD Stewardship Program. As we now round the bend into Lent (which begins March 9 with Ash Wednesday), I want to make it clear that 17+10=CD wasn't simply a month-long sermon series. It was an invitation to make the things I talked about personal and particular, using six powerful but very simple spiritual practices.

What does the "17" mean? It represents committing TIME to becoming a disciple. In the Bible, the standard for returning God's gifts back to God is the tithe: 10%. We are all used to hearing about tithing money, but what about our

time? If a 7 day week has 168 hours in it, that means 10% is just shy of 17 hours per week; 17 hours of time dedicated to practices that help us to follow Jesus more closely. The "10" in 17+10=CD does indeed refer to our money: a tithe of our treasure. It's one of the 6 power practices. Yeah, it's integral to the whole concept, but it's not the most important one unless YOU want to see it that way.

Not just money

I don't know at what point in the life of the church the term "Stewardship" became synonymous with "giving money;" It's so much more! As Christians, we start out with the premise that God doesn't give us just our money— God gives us our very existence; as the Rite I prayer puts it, "ourselves, our souls and bodies." God entrusts God's Holy Spirit to each of us, and Stewardship begins the instant we acknowledge that by living as if that is really true. The best way I ever heard this stated is, "Stewardship is everything you do with your life after you say 'I believe in God...'"

Power Surge

Perhaps the best synonym for "stewardship" is "discipleship." I don't think anyone would argue that discipleship is something we do one Sunday a year as a fundraiser for the church; disciple-

ship is living out our faith all day, every day— not for 52 Sundays, but for 365 and ¼ days a year. The most practical book on discipleship I ever read was one called Power Surge: Six Marks of Discipleship for a Changing Church by a pastor named Michael Foss (Fortress Press, 2000.) The six power practices are simple, but transformational when taken seriously. What are they?

- **FIRST**, disciples PRAY— EVERY DAY. Think you're too busy for that? Martin Luther is reported to have said: "I have so much to do today, I'll need to pray for two hours instead of one." When you've got a lot to do, you need to make sure that everything is deeply grounded in your faith, setting a solid foundation for the whole day's work.
- **SECOND**, disciples take time to READ the Bible. Hearing a lesson or two every Sunday is good, but there's a lot

more to the Bible than can be covered in a few minutes on Sunday. We have reading to get you started. Or, read a devotional book or pamphlet. Just choose something!

- **THIRD**, disciples engage in the power practice of **WEEKLY WORSHIP**. Worship is both the source of discipleship and the result of it, because worshipping God in a community actively seeking spiritual transformation gives you more than you receive.
- **FOURTH**, disciples seek real, authentic spiritual fellowship—**RELATING** to others, where you talk with others about the Big Questions: your faith story; doubt and hope and despair; how you're doing in your discipleship, how you've blown it again and again; and how you're finding ways to be a better steward.
- **FIFTH** is **SERVING**, which doesn't mean "drudgery!" When engaged in as a power practice, to serve means to use the talents and gifts God gave you to bring a little slice of heaven to yourself and others in the middle of everyday life in a broken world— wherever in the

world you happen to be: home, work, school, the golf course, the grocery store, driving on US19...

- **SIXTH** and last is the dreaded "10%" of our money. By now I hope you'll see this power practice of financial stewardship is simply one aspect of discipleship, of following Christ, of making the kingdom of God nearer for yourself and others.

Intentional Stewardship

How are you going to divvy up the 17 hours? It's totally up to you, based on the kind of power you think you need most in your life. However, this focus on stewardship and discipleship is core and key to who we are as a community. Intentional stewardship like this may seem daunting, but remember, discipleship is a process, and like learning to walk or play the piano or any other skill, no one is born a pro at it, and no one ever outgrows the need for intentional commitment and practice.

Repent

This brings me to my last thought for this month. Lent is often seen as a dismal, dark time of regret, remorse and feeling really, really bad about ourselves

for what we've done in the past. But the past is done with and we can't alter it; the only thing we can affect is the future. So, rather than hone in why you might feel regret and remorse, I'm going to explore repentance. Isn't that the same thing? No, it's not. To "repent" means to turn— turn from one path of living and onto another one, a better, more joy-filled and purposeful one patterned on the healing, inclusive, dignifying and courageous road Jesus trod. Beginning with Ash Wednesday, I invite you to Turn... and Live $17+10=CD$ over those 40 days, I hope surging into spiritual power you have never known before.

Beautiful Symbols or Budget Drains?

— Thoughts about our altar flowers by Pastor Becky

Since I arrived at the Church of the Good Shepherd, I’ve noticed that on most of the weeks the flowers are “Given to the Glory of God.” This means that no one in the congregation sponsored and paid for our two vases, a cost of \$50 per week. A quick look at our financials showed that the operating budget absorbed well over \$1,000 to cover expenses for flowers.

So, I have to wonder: how important are flowers to this worshipping community? Yes, of course they are beautiful symbols of life and hope and creation. I love fresh flowers as much as anyone, but at what cost? We’ve systematically been cutting our outreach budget (along

with many other line items) to be fiscally lean and responsible. I have to admit, if this church has \$1,000 of discretionary money to spend, personally, I’d rather help the desperate eat, or be housed, or get a tankful of gas to get to work. Others of you, however, may not feel the same way, and are of the opinion that flowers are as legitimate an expenditure for the gathered worshipping community as wine, bread and candles. I certainly understand and appreciate that perspective.

In Lent, traditionally we don’t put fresh flowers in the chancel. During this season of reflection, I invite our congregation to consider a proposal that

comes from the Altar Guild, the Worship Committee and the Finance Committee: On any given Sunday, flowers will be ordered for the chancel only if there are sponsors for both vases for that week.

Communicate

Please do not hesitate to let me or a member of Vestry or the chair of one of the above-named committees know what you think about the proposal. Of course, the simplest way to deal with the matter would be for people to sponsor one or more weeks, which might quickly solve the problem! A sign-up sheet will be on a clipboard in the back of the church.

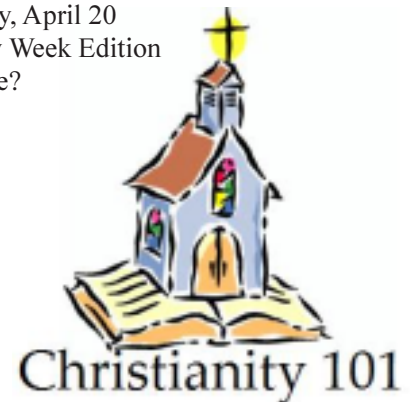
